## GLOBALLY HARMONIZED SYSTEM (GHS) OSHA'S REVISED HAZARD COMMUNICATION STANDARD

## ATTENTION ALL MEMBERS:

Effective December 1, 2013, the Department of Labor mandated that all *employers* train their employees on the revised OSHA HAZCOM Standard. If you have taken the OSHA 10-Hour or 30-Hour class with Local 28 since August 2013, you have already been trained and should receive a certificate from the Apprentice School by the end of December 2013.

If you are currently in the OSHA class that began in December 2013 or any future OSHA classes at the Apprentice School, the HAZCOM training will be indicated on the back of your OSHA card.

Many contractors are conducting the training for their employees on site. If you have not been trained by your employer or have not signed up for upcoming OSHA classes at the Apprentice School, please contact your employer about receiving this very important training.
